### *Edward Sicking Played Second For Reds, Others*

One-time Major Leagues second baseman Edward J. Sicking, who operated the Sportsman's Cafe in St. Bernard for 25 years, died Wednesday. He was at Woodside Manor Nursing Home, Madeira, at the time of his death.

A native Cincinnati, Mr. Sicking played in the Major Leagues for five years. He was in 37 games with the Redlegs in 1920, with a batting average of .268. His career average was .226. He also played for the Chicago Cubs, the old New York Giants and Pittsburgh Pirates. Altogether, he spent 15 years in major and minor league ball.

A veteran of World War I, Mr. Sicking is survived by his wife, Lorraine Tebbe Sicking; a daughter, Mrs. Joan Rogers; three sons, Thomas, James and Jack, and a sister, Mrs. Eleanor Luers.
