Plans Completed For Symphonic Spectacular

AMUSEMENTS

The Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra announced Friday complete plans for its third annual Symphonic Stadium Spectacular at Riverfront Stadium, Sunday, September 10.

In addition to trumpeter Al Hirt, the full orchestra conducted by Erich Kunzel, a fireworks display, a new sound system, the program will feature The Symphony Jazz Quintet and the Roger Bacon High School Band.

The band will perform a pre-concert marching show beginning at 7:10 p.m. (concert time is 7:30 p.m.) and then join the orchestra to perform "Festival Overture" by Shostakovich and the Wilhousky arrangement of "Battle Hymn of the Republic."

Roger Bacon's band won

the Ohio State Fair Band Competition in both 1970 and 1971 and captured second place in 1971 at the "Festival of States" band competition in Florida. Wesley Neal is the band's

music director, and Fr. Celsus Griesse is moderator.

Also appearing in the Stadium Spectacular will be the Symphony Jazz Quintet—Marie Speziale, trumpet; Paul Piller, trom-

bone; Frank Proto, piano; Robert Bradley, bass; and Jimmy Seward, drums.

In addition to the two above-named selections, the CSO will play Last's Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2;

selections from "Fiddler on the Roof"; "Aquarius" from the musical "Hair," featuring the Symphony Jazz Quintet, and "Five and Reim" by Taylor-Proto, with Carmon DeLeone on horn and Marie Speziale on trumpet.

AMONG THE many favorites which Al Hirt will perform during the evening are "Night and Day," "Carnival of Venice," "South Rampart Street Parade," "Birth of the Blues," "Do You Know What it Means to Miss New Orleans?" and theme from "Carnival."

Hirt will bring along his group of musicians from

New Orleans. Joseph Spitzler, clarinet, and Paul Ferrara, drums, have been with Hirt for many years and will be with him for the Stadium Spectacular.

The Symphonic Stadium Spectacular is a benefit for the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra Pension Fund. Admission is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children under 12. There are no reserved seats, so come early and bring a picnic. Tickets are now available at the Community Ticket Office 20 W. Fourth St., and at the Stadium beginning at 10 a.m. on the day of the concert.
